Dear Members and Friends of First Presbyterian,

In the process of researching material for the January newsletter, I came across a reflection of some meditations in my copy of the *Daily Feast* that was written by Dr. Rev. Thomas Henry Troeger who passed away less than three years ago at the age of seventy-seven after a life of serving others.

During that time, he was a hymn writer, preacher, professor, theologian, poet, musician, columnist, author, and ordained first in the Presbyterian Church and later in the Episcopal Church, which made him one of the first ministers in our nation to be dually aligned with both traditions.

Dr. Troeger was reflecting on the bible passage of Matthew 2:13-23 The Escape to Egypt and The Return to Nazareth. This passage takes up about a half page in our pew bible so I won't include it here, but I suggest that you read it and refresh your memories. But I found his reflection on this writing of Matthew's to be interestingly timely. Dr. Troeger's reflection is as follows:

"It is the custom in most homes and churches that set up manger scenes to take them down after Christmas and store them until the season returns next year. Matthew's account of the Holy Family's trials suggests that this is wrong. Perhaps we should put away all the shepherds because they returned to their fields, and put away all the magi because they returned to their distant home, but we should keep out Jesus, Mary and Joseph. Just the three of them all alone facing the terrors of a brutal despot. No visitors. No sheltering barn. No cuddly looking sheep. No friendly oxen. Then we should move the Holy Family to another location in

our church or home. Perhaps to a window looking on the larger world, the world where there is still violence and repression and terror, and where there are refugees fleeing, needing protection, human beings in whom the Christ is crying to us for protection." Thomas H. Troeger

Possibly you have a nativity scene in your home or church and might remove all of the comforting figures that protect the Holy Family and then move it to an isolated place of danger.

God, let us rest in your protection as we face the Herods of this world. Amen.
